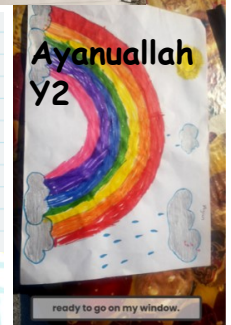
Dear Diary,

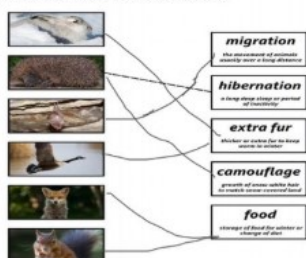
Write 5 facts about Jacques Cousteau:
