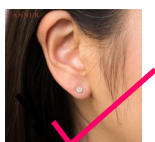

5th November—School Nurse administering Flu Vaccine to children who have permission.

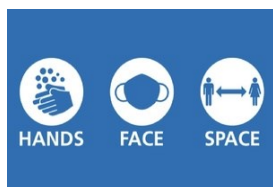
DECEMBER:
