### Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Build secure attachments with a key person.

### **Physical Development**

- Begin to meet their own care needs e.g. using the toilet, washing and drying hands independently.
- Become confident in feeding themselves using an open cup and manipulating utensils well.
- Enjoy the outdoor space and walk, run, jump and climb with greater confidence.

### Literacy

- Choose and enjoy a range of songs, rhymes, poems and stories.
- Make marks in a range of media such as dough, gloop, sand etc.







### Maths

- Begin to anticipate times of the day such as mealtimes and home time.
- Be able to recognise and name colours in a range of contexts, colours in nature, and colours in the environment and begin to attach colours to themselves.
- Recite numbers past five.
- Enjoy playing with and correctly fit puzzle pieces together.

# **Understanding the World**

- Enjoy pretend play and imitate everyday actions and events from own family and cultural background.
- Use all of their senses in hands-on exploration of natural materials.
- Explore and operate cause and effect resources and digital equipment.

# **Expressive Arts and Design**

- Start to develop pretend play, using an object to represent something else even though they are not similar.
- Explore colour and colour mixing.
